SENATOR BEUTLER: And so those who are involved in manufacturing, for example, of personal property, jobs involving the manufacturing of personal property are higher paying than a job at a welder's shop that might be in the business of expanding a couple, three new jobs?

SENATOR ENGEL: Perhaps in certain areas maybe they pay the welders more than they pay these manufacturers, but the...and they just have to have a certain percent...I think what you're trying to avoid here, Chris, I mean, Senator Beutler, I'm sorry...

SENATOR BEUTLER: No, that's...

SENATOR ENGEL: I don't want to be too familiar here on the floor, is that, you know, the McDonald's and so forth, that type of jobs, they're a good job but normally they're minimum paying jobs and usually it's the people, the average person that works there is to supplement a student's wages or to supplement other income, so it's not the type of job that a person can...

SENATOR ENGEL: ...one person can afford to feed their family, buy homes and so forth.
