

Chambers amendment to the Engel amendment to LB 425. We are accepting call-in votes. Senators, please check in. SENATOR BEUTLER: Madam President, members of the Legislature, this amendment is very simple, intended to be very friendly and simply attempts to tie together a little more closely the Wickersham amendment to the Engel amendment in the sense that I think it was intended and it's just a two word amendment on the Wickersham amendment where it refers to businesses the policies that need to be adopted. It puts in the word "qualified" businesses in front of the word businesses in two instances and that's merely to tie it to the definition of qualified businesses that appears elsewhere in the Engel amendment and which I think is intended by all the parties, and if I've missed the connection some place, I simply need to have it pointed out to me. But I think this further brings the two amendments together. Thank you.
