SENATOR BEUTLER: Madam President, what this amendment does then is to simply eliminate the word "significant" from the factor, responding to Senator Maurstad's assertion that it is somewhat subjective. I do think it needs...I think there needs to be something like that there, but at this point in time I don't want to hold up the advancement of the bill anymore. I don't have any more amendments and I would like to see the bill put together in the form that it's in now so we can review it one more time. It's getting to be a little confused, so I'm hoping we can make short work of this. Thank you.
