LR 80, 87

Legislature is in session and capable of transacting business, I propose to sign and do sign LR 80 and LR 87. Would also, I think, like to, before we start our afternoon activities, just visit a little bit, announce some of the things we'll be doing. When we get to this phase of the session, people kind of like to be able to look ahead and see what will be happening in the foreseeable future, so let me go through some of those things. The agenda for tomorrow will include some Final Reading, some Select File. We will be working through the lunch hour based upon the survey I took of members. That appears to be the dominant choice of members on the last day of the week. Then at two o'clock, we will be going to consent calendar Select File. Those bills will be out. Those will be bills that advanced the other day from General File on consent and we will be following the consent calendar rules on those bills tomorrow afternoon at two o'clock. On Monday, we will be on General File. We will be dealing with, I don't recall the bill number, but Senator Bohlke's priority bill, the welfare reform bill, will be placed on the agenda. It is out of committee and has been for some time. It will be placed on the agenda on Monday. It will be the first bill up and so those of you with a particular interest in that bill should be advised that that will be up on Monday. Tuesday and Wednesday primarily we will be dealing with Select File legislation. Also on Wednesday at eleven, we will be special ordering a bill or a request from the Revenue Committee for a bill introduction. That is a 30-vote measure. We'll special order that at eleven and then on Thursday of next week, again, we'll be working through the lunch hour and it will be a consent calendar day. It may very well, depending upon how things work out, it may be the last time that we devote a full day to consent calendar, at least for General File consent calendar bills. Hopefully, that gives you some indication of what we'll be doing over the next five legislative days. Mr. Clerk, General File, LB 646.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 646, a bill originally introduced by Senator Kristensen. (Read title.) The bill was introduced in January of this year. At that time it was reported, I should say referred to the Revenue Committee for public hearing. The bill was advanced to General File. There are committee amendments pending by the Revenue Committee, Mr. Clerk.
