SENATOR HALL: And all that, the purpose for that is, it says, is because of the change that you made earlier with regard to the General Fund, correct?

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Right. You've got to be consistent if you're going to go to all state funds.

SENATOR HALL: Okay. I just wanted to make sure because it dealt with the assessment issue, and if you read it on its face...

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: It doesn't make any sense.

SENATOR HALL: Well, and what it would say is that you would still be assessed but you wouldn't be able to access the fund without the previous portion of your amendment which...

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Well, and realize that there's a delayed...that goes back to that delayed issue we talked about.

SENATOR HALL: Right. Right, but I mean because you strike it and you use a General Fund issue, it's not a problem the way I read it.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Yes.
