SPEAKER WITHEM: LB 112 passes. LB 154.

CLERK: (Read LB 154 on Final Reading.)

SPEAKER WITHEM: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 154 pass? Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Read record vote. See page 1548 of the Legislative Journal.) 40 ayes, 0 nays, 2 present and not voting, 7 excused and not voting.

SPEAKER WITHEM: LB 154 passes, LB 581.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Janssen would move to return the bill for a specific amendment found on page 1505 of the Journal.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Janssen.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Mr. Speaker, members, the amendment can be found on Journal page 1505 is the same amendment that I attempted to put onto 581 on Select File. There was some controversy about that in the amount of revenue which may be lost in this process and checking with the Department of Revenue and fiscal office, why there is no impact upon the revenue to their understanding at the present time. It is the intent, it is...this amendment was the intent of the Legislature in 1993 when the bill was passed. All it does is tells you that you cannot, that you can either file the return for a business or two. If you've got a multiple business in the state, you may file the litter tax statement for all of those businesses if you've got two or three or six or eight. That was the intent of the Legislature when the initial bill was passed and I've worked this out with Senator Beutler and he offered to let me bring the bill back on Final Reading if there was no impact on the fiscal note. And I just would hope that you would support me in returning it to Select File to put this amendment back on. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Beutler.
