So I believe that this amendment is something that will actually strengthen the bill. It will give another option for a father to claim paternity beside the notice of publication, which is only at the last resort, and I would hope that you would support this amendment. Thank you.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Stuhr. Before we take up the debate on the Stuhr amendment, I would like to call the legislators' attention to the north balcony where Senator Robak has 40 seventh and eighth graders from District 9 in Columbus, with their teachers. Will you all stand and be recognized by your Legislature. Mr. Clerk, you have an amendment.

CLERK: Madam President, Senator Matzke would move to amend, first of all with AM1529, Senator.

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Matzke.

SENATOR MATZKE: Madam President, members, this is a very small amendment, 1529. It adds one phrase to line 24 on page 1533 of the Journal. Senator Bromm, not Senator Bromm, Senator Stuhr, I beg your pardon, proposed amendment refers to within five business days after receipt of notice pursuant to section such-and-such, and this amendment would say, or within five business days after the last date of any published notice provided pursuant to Section 7 of this act. All it does is add in a reference to the published notice.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Matzke. For debate or discussion on the Matzke amendment, Senator Hall. Senator Wehrbein, on the Matzke amendment. Thank you. I see no further lights on discussion on your amendment, Senator Matzke. Do you want to close?

SENATOR MATZKE: I would just request that for clarification that this amendment, 1529, to the Stuhr amendment be adopted.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you. You have heard the closing on the Matzke amendment to the Stuhr amendment. The question is the adoption of that amendment. All in favor vote aye, opposed no. We are voting on the Matzke amendment to the Stuhr amendment, have you all voted?
