

SPEAKER WITHEM: Thank you, Senator Wehrbein. At this point, I would announce that we have 15 seventh graders from Newcastle Public School in the north balcony along with their teacher. I would also indicate that it is one fifty-seven. We have three more speakers wishing to speak to this amendment, so it is unlikely we will get to a decision on it, so I believe we will leave this bill at this point. When we return to it, the Stuhr amendment will be the pending matter before the body. And at this time, as I indicated, I'd call, I'd raise the call. We will move to consent calendar, Select File. Let me announce for those of you with an interest in following the bills, those bills that have been pulled from the agenda, quite a number of them. There is LB 505, LB 509, LB 344, and LB 434. In other words, that is the first four bills on the consent calendar that have been pulled. Then skip two, and you go to LB 609, that bill has been pulled from the agenda. LB 447, that bill has been pulled from the agenda. And then we get down to LB 563 and LB 563A, at this point, that bill has been pulled from the agenda. And Senator Beutler, just to add to the list, has indicated that he would like to have his bill, LB 396 pulled from the agenda, so that one will be also. That is 505, 509, 344, 434, 609, 447, 563, 563A, and 396. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, the first bill I have is LB 434. Senator Maurstad, I have E & R amendments pending.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Maurstad. Pardon me, Mr. Clerk, there must be some misunderstanding. Was 434 not one of those bills that was taken from the agenda? I am sorry, there was a misunderstanding. It was my misunderstanding, Senator Wehrbein, LB 434 is, in fact, continuing on the list. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, 434, E & R amendments pending, Senator.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Maurstad.

SENATOR MAURSTAD: Mr. Speaker, I'd move to adopt the E & R amendments to LB 434.

SPEAKER WITHEM: You've heard the motion. All in favor say aye. Opposed. The E & R amendments are adopted.
