CLERK: 17 ayes, 0 nays to go under call.

SPEAKER WITHEM: The house is under call. Members, please return to the floor. Senator Witek.

SENATOR WITEK: (Microphone not activated)...the vote, on the vote.

SPEAKER WITHEM: On calling the question?

SENATOR WITEK: No.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Okay, we'll get to that. Okay. The house is under call. Would members please return to the floor, record their presence. Senator Maurstad, how do you want to proceed?

SENATOR MAURSTAD: Call-in votes.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Call-in votes have been authorized. The question before the body at the moment is ceasing debate.

CLEPK: Senator Hall voting yes. Senator Preister voting yes. Senator Lynch voting yes. Senator Hartnett voting yes. Senator Dierks voting yes.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays to cease debate, Mr. President.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Debate is ceased on the Witek amendment. I would remind the body we are under call and, beings we're going right into a vote, I'm going to leave the house under call. Would members please take their seats. Members not in the Chamber, please return to the floor. Senator Witek, you are recognized to close.

SENATOR WITEK: Mr. Speaker, I will just do a short close. The decision that we're making here is to strike. My amendment strikes Section 15 of the committee amendments, page 5 and 6. What that is doing is tying the decisor for need for an individual to qualify for ADC to the Consumer Price Index. Senator Wesely has indicated it would enlarge the pool by a considerable amount. I believe he said 43 percent possible.
