SENATOR CHAMBERS: But...and give...and they would agree to go to a certain location to die, so we could have Watts, or whoever has the garbage pickup...

SENATOR HALL: Preferably outside of the state so then we wouldn't be subject to the cost of burials.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Now, I am going to support this amendment because Senator Hall is bringing us right to it.
