They will be taking care of...

SENATOR CROSBY: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...politicians, businessmen, and maybe the police, then, will leave them alone, so that they can make a living. Maybe we will have some modern day Mata Haris who will have HIV and say I am going to fix those who put me out here. And they will give it away, Senator Vrtiska, and as doggish as many men are, they will be happy for the opportunity, and then they will run because this woman will let them know, hey, buddy, you'd better go have yourself tested, and you say, and if I don't, you will have things falling off of you, so you'd better go let a doctor test you. And you will run to the doctor, and they will get a test, and they will say, oh-oh, you got the big one. You got HIV. This is wonderful, and do you know what? I think it will affect more of you all than it will my kind, because I will explain to my people what is happening; that this is a way that white people have contrived to level the playing field and get rid of a lot of their own because there are far more white people receiving welfare than black people.

SENATOR CROSBY: Time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So I hope that this amendment is adopted; not for that racial reason, but for the humanitarian reasons that I have mentioned earlier.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Before we continue with the next speaker, I'd like to call the Legislature's attention to the north balcony where Senator Jones has as his guests ten women from Ainsworth who are members of the FHA, and their sponsor.
