And I don't know anybody in America who doesn't have access to clothing or to go to Goodwill or Salvation Army or any of those areas that you can get...I know people on this floor who keep urging me to go there and get some good bargains for clothes to wear to work because that's quite an expense. What kind of clothing now are we talking about? Maybe you can expand on that when you get some time on the microphone, Senator Beutler, and tell us what lifestyle we're supposed to support for individuals who are turning to the government and certainly if you know of anybody because I do not and I'm being very honest. I don't know anybody who can't get clothes and, as far as winter clothing, if you're thinking of winter clothing, anytime anybody in my area has some problems getting winter clothing, and it's not always because they can't get it, sometimes there's problems within the family where they don't get it and we make sure that those kids have mittens and I've even knitted, believe it or not, scarves when...you know, and a skein of yarn is only like less than a dollar for a scarf and, you know, these things are all, people make do, they just do. They always have. They've always had access to these things and saying that if they can't find clothing that they can have access to this, to me, it's just putting in another layer, another opportunity for somebody to define what clothing has to be and then somebody has to make sure that they absolutely don't have that and, you know, just another bureaucratic step to complicate something that should be so simple and I oppose it.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Witek. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam President, members of the Legislature, and, Senator Witek, I don't have an answer on all the questions, but as far as the housing, in the summertime there will be sod houses, in the wintertime there will be igloos. Senator Witek, did you get that on the housing? In the summertime the houses will be sod houses or thatch and in the wintertime they'll be igloos because we're not going to give too much and I don't understand on the garage sales because I've never seen anybody wear a garage before, but out there in Millard they might do strange things. Members of the Legislature, the last comment I made, I thought it was so outrageous that I would get some objection, but instead I'm getting support so I want to make it
