

some different concerns. I have some different concerns. I'm not trying to harm the bill. What this bracket motion is until Thursday, two days. And I would hope that Senator Chambers, Senator Matzke, Senator Stuhr, Senator Bromm, myself and others might be able to sit down and work out some of these details so that off the floor we can get some of these things, try to work out, present them to the body, otherwise I suspect this is going to take a long time today. And I think there are times that we need to work things out on the floor and move through, and there are times we need to say, time out, let's get some people together to work off the floor to see if we can get some of these things worked out, and then the bill would come up again very quickly, in fact it would come up again the next time we go to Select File. And it would give a chance for, I think, those of us to work on the bill. And if nothing is accomplished it would then come up again immediately the next time we go to Select File. I think this is the time where the body can use its prerogative, say, look, why don't we work a little bit more with people off the floor, try to get some things done. Other people who are interested can certainly be involved as well to save us some time on the floor to some of the other bills coming up that may in fact be worked out a little bit better. So I offer this in good faith, this particular bracket motion.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Bernard-Stevens. Senator Bohlke, do you wish to speak to the bracket motion?

SENATOR BOHLKE: Madam President, members, I actually had my light on to speak to some of the discussion that was going on on the floor regarding this. My concern with the bracket motion, Senator Bernard-Stevens, is that we get to a point where everyone is following along and understanding the discussion and the direction and the different philosophies on the floor, and then we bracket it and it's two days later and we have to come back and start all over again with possible new amendments and everything. I'm not necessarily opposed to the bracket, but if we could have a little more time this morning, I've been listening to the discussion, it's been very helpful to me in answering some questions and raising some questions. So I would appreciate maybe another half an hour or so to continue on with the dialogue that we're having at this point and certainly open to how the rest of the body feels at this point in time.
