She pointed three other places that if we're going to strike the "and obtain custody", it would be on page 2, line 14, page 3, lines 4 and 9 both, so the amendment is the same amendment we had before us but it completely strikes those sections that Senator Bromm and I were referring to. Senator Stuhr also indicated that, I believe she indicated, and she can shake her head vehemently no if she disagrees, but I believe Senator Stuhr is in support of the amendment that we have before us, so that's all the amendment does. It's still the same amendment but it does completely change the amendment to reflect the intent of the Bromm-Bernard-Stevens amendment.
