That scares me to death to think that I would have to go in there and show that my 14-year-old mother has exercised due diligence throughout all of the steps and proceedings of the bill. So we do have the affidavit, as Senator Matzke pointed out, which strongly suggests that you must tell the truth, language about perjury if you don't tell the truth, so those things are there. But I'm not comfortable with leaving due diligence language in there as a requirement on the part of the mother or the appointment of a guardian ad litem if the court finds there hasn't been due diligence. I will leave it at that. I think we've...the issue is fairly simple and I ask the body to adopt this amendment. Thank you.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Thank you, Senator Bromm. You've heard the closing on the Bromm amendment. The question, is shall the Bromm amendment be adopted? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 1 nay, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Bromm's amendment.

SPEAKER WITHEM: The Bromm amendment is adopted. The next item, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Senator Hall, you have AM1532, Senator.

I have four, to be exact, that are...I think following the same vein that Senator Bromm's amendment that he just had adopted, the last two amendments that were technical kinds of questions. I would like to allow Senator Matzke the ability to have his bill in the final form for purposes of having it...all the amendments that, whether they be technical or not, depending on whether they are supported or not by the introducer, be addressed and, for that reason, I would like to pass over this amendment right now and let it go to the bottom of the list if that's all right, Mr. Speaker, and then we can
