

CLERK: 16 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Madam President.

SENATOR CROSBY: The house is under call. Would all senators please return to the Chamber and record your presence. Would all unauthorized personnel please leave the floor.

SENATOR HALL: Madam President, if I could ask, when folks are assembled, if we could go ahead and call the roll. Thank you.

SENATOR CROSBY: As soon as everybody is here.

SENATOR HALL: Yeah.

SENATOR CROSBY: Okay, thank you, thank you, I wanted to be sure I understood you. Senator Bernard-Stevens, Senator Lindsay, Senator Lynch, the house is under call.
