

child, if she is allowed to change her mind because she didn't want the father to have custody, does that principle hold true with reference to the adopted family, or do we have blinders on? Would you say that she should be allowed to revoke if she finds out who the family is and objects violently to that family?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: If that happened, yes, I think so, Senator.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. And you are being consistent and I think it should too. If you look at what happens in a case that happened in Nebraska not long ago where this black woman, it happened to be this time, had her child taken and adopted and a couple of days after the child was taken she wanted the child back and said she thought from the papers that she could get the child back. She lost, and this is what the Appeals Court said, she received comprehensive information about the legal and emotional consequences of her decision, and the relinquishment is valid...

SENATOR CROSBY: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...said the Appeals Court. We conclude that Jones simply changed her mind. And they talk about how she understood the papers that she was shown and things such as that, but there is an interesting thing that you see further down in the article. It says educational and clinical psychologists testified that Miss Jones has an IQ of 72 and has problems reading and comprehending. So, see, judges, white judges will lie also. This woman has an IQ of 72 and they are going to say she understands things which some people reading this bill don't understand, and they took her child. That's the kind of system that I am offering this amendment to try to modify and mitigate in terms of the damage that is done. There are fictions undertaken, falsehoods told in order to justify taking these women's children, and I think it is wrong, and I will support Senator Bernard-Stevens'...
