

final. I think that it is inappropriate, at this time, to take LB 712 and turn it into a completely different bill dealing with a completely different item, and I would urge this body emphatically to vote in opposition...

SENATOR CROSBY: One minute.

SENATOR MATZKE: ...to Senator Chambers amendment and vote in opposition to Senator Bernard-Stevens amendment to the Chambers amendment.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Matzke. Senator Maurstad.

SENATOR MAURSTAD: I call the question.

SENATOR CROSBY: The question has been called. Do I see five hands? I do. The question is, shall debate cease on the Bernard-Stevens amendment? All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. Senator Maurstad. There is a request for a call of the house. All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 16 ayes, 0 nays to go under call.

SENATOR CROSBY: The house is under call. Will all senators please check in. Would all senators return to the Chamber and record your presence. Would all unauthorized personnel please leave the floor. We are voting on...we are voting on the amendment to...the Bernard-Stevens' amendment to the Chambers' amendment, and a roll call vote has been requested. We are voting on ceasing debate, I beg your pardon. We are looking for Senators Abboud, Beutler, Lindsay, Senator Lynch, Senator McKenzie, Senator Robinson, Senator Schmitt, Senator Elmer, Senator Will. Senator Robinson. Senator Abboud, Senator Elmer, the house is under call, and Senator Lindsay. Senator Maurstad said we could start the roll call, Mr. Clerk. Go in reverse order.

CLERK: (Roll call vote commenced. See pages 1619-20 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR CROSBY: We are voting on calling the question.

CLERK: Reverse order, excuse me. (Roll call vote continued and completed.) 31 ayes, 1 nay to cease debate.
