

people as they are making that determination if they will be possibly going to a nursing home facility. Currently with what Senator Wesely's bill would do is at that time we would have, and he said that it can be other agencies. I have talked to my hospital. There has been no contracting with my hospital where there is a social service worker. They are going to have to wait until the person arrives from the Department of Aging to come in, go do that interview, walk into the room and say, we need to determine from your financial records if in a year you will be Medicaid eligible. Now Senator Wesely has said, changed that a little when I asked if it's financial records, he said yes. He then tried to soften it a little later and said basic information. Well that's my point. I think, and he said it's not intrusive to go into those rooms and ask that kind of information. I have a feeling that people in the hospital who are determining if they have to go to a nursing home or not and have people come in and ask for their financial records, I think they'd consider that intrusive. I say that's beyond basic information and I think this is something that we could recognize in a pilot project. The other argument was, let's let the pilot project work and then come back a year later, I'm premature. I tell you, if we look at something that is radically wrong, if it smells in a pilot project, it's going to smell when we take it statewide and we are going to hear about it. I think we have a chance to recognize that this is wrong, it's intrusive and it's a real invasion of privacy, therefore, I ask you to support the Bohlke amendment.
