

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The rules are suspended. We can now proceed with the discussion of the Wesely amendment. Senator Wesely, to open. I raise the call.

SENATOR WESELY: This ought to be described as a cat amendment because it's had almost as many lives as a cat. (Laugh.) It talks about partial filling out of prescriptions for the terminally ill that are not going to need, well anyway, and making some terminology changes. It is not a major, earth-shattering amendment but it would clean up some problems in this area and I'd ask for adoption of the amendment.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Wesely. Is there any discussion? Seeing none, Senator Wesely waives closing. The question before you is the adoption of the Wesely amendment to LB 406. All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. Please record.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on adoption of Senator Wesely's amendment.
