

else wants to challenge germaneness, I won't do it this time. I've already made my position that it's not germane, I don't think it's germane, the Chair has ruled that it's not germane, and you've taken out the juvenile justice, which I appreciate because we would have bracketed that portion out or least divided that portion out. But the point is and, Senator Dierks, thank you. The point is that, members of the Legislature, we have...we all have bills and we all have bills that are important. And there are mechanisms in there for us to get the bills passed. And if we don't take advantage of the mechanisms then we need to follow the rules that we have. Senator Dierks should file a motion to suspend the rules to offer a nongermane amendment. But if the body wants to do the amendment that's fine, but I'm very cautious and I hope the body is as lenient to nongermane amendments when we really get down to crunch time and we get to some education bills. I've got some amendments now that I think now all of a sudden are looking more germane than ever. So I appreciate that. Senator Dierks, I appreciate you taking out the juvenile services part of it. I still don't think it's germane but I'm not going to be the one to raise the question this time.
