

experience for an individual and it's something that should be addressed and I support that part. My concern is going to lie basically with opening it up all across the board where all child labor laws are waived or may be waived upon approval of the department for, you know, television or radio or theater or whatever the case may be. And, Senator Landis, I guess what I would just like to do is ask you a question. Would you be willing...and I think the answer is yes, because you and I have talked about it, but we'll be willing to look at whether or not we need to do the wide open approach or narrow it down just for the movies. Between now and Select File, I assume we can...we can figure out if it makes any difference to narrow it or if it helps or hinders. Would you be willing to sit down between now and Select File on that?

SENATOR LANDIS: I would. The source of the bill is the Department of Economic Development. I think they care about bringing television and movie productions to this state and this would be an assistance to that, so there may be some aspect that it's overreaching since it does relate to theater and radio and so there might be some reason to examine the nature of the bill along those lines. I would be happy to do so. There is a nub of experience here that we want to respond to. It arises in those made-for-TV movies, movie productions, and that, I think, we do want to act on this year. But I would entertain appropriate amendments limiting it if the body is desirous of doing so.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: And I'm glad you used the word entertain a motion, it's apropos for this particular bill. And, with that, I rise to support the advancement at least for now of LB 330.
