SENATOR ABOUD: Madam President, members, just taking a moment, the committee did look at the issue that Senator Bernard-Stevens was addressing and since these individuals are being compensated for the work, we chose not to limit it to strictly movie or television productions. It was our belief that in some instances there's crossover and we felt comfortable with the language that was in the bill but certainly are open to any suggestions that Bernard-Stevens, Senator Bernard-Stevens may have to make the bill even better. With that, I rise to support the advancement of the bill. Thank you.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Abboud. Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: Madam President, members, as Senator Abboud knows, I have a bill that's still in the Business and Labor Committee dealing with this topic as well and updating some of the information regarding the restrictions on child labor. And I would have some concerns on this as well but I think that the advancement of the bill is in order but I would like to work with Senator Landis on this as well. So I support the bill but I'm glad that it's been brought to our attention and explained as well as Senator Landis has explained it so we can now take a look at it.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Wesely. Any further discussion on the advancement of LB 330? Seeing none, Senator Landis waives closing. The question before you is the advancement of LB 330. All those in favor vote aye; those opposed vote nay. Please record.
