When the bill was offered, even the auditor did not appear against it and it is drafted in such a way as to make it clear that nothing in the statutes referred to by the auditor are designed to require these housing authorities to submit their budgeted for auditing or filing to the auditor's office. If you have any questions, I will answer them, but in case Senator Schrock or Senator Brown would like to say something I would offer either of them time based on my opening.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Schrock, would you care to use some of Senator Chambers' time?

SENATOR SCHROCK: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, this issue was brought to me by the county supervisor in Harlan County and soon after the Legislature convened it was discovered that Senator Chambers and I had introduced essentially the same bill. After conferring with Senator Chambers I agreed to withdraw my bill so we wouldn't have two similar bills. He has explained it very well and I totally concur with what the bill is trying to do.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Senator Schrock. Senator Brown, would you care to use some of the opening? She waives. Senator Robinson, your light is next.

SENATOR ROBINSON: Mr. Speaker, members of the body, you know I think this is probably a good bill to filibuster for about 15 minutes but you know, my voice, I'm having trouble with my voice right now and you know, I could probably speak about the prospects for the second national championship or let's see, the digestive system or let's see, but you know Senator Chambers...Senator Chambers did such a good job. He was the only one in the hearing room. He blew out the auditor's office and I think he even convinced Janssen to vote for the bill so I guess I have to stand up and say I support this bill with Senator Chambers.
