ASSISTANT CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of committee amendments.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Committee amendments are adopted. Senator Vrtiska, to open on your bill.

SENATOR VRTISKA: The opening on the bill is somewhat similar to what I had already told you about the bill. It is an important bill for those ag societies who failed to keep their corporation in existence and this would give them an opportunity to retroactively reinitiate their articles of incorporation and make some of the things that they have done during a short period of time when they were not incorporated legal, and that's about what the bill does and I ask for your cooperation in advancing it to E & R Initial. Thank you.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Any discussion? Seeing none, the question then before the body is the advancement of LB 671 to E & R Initial. All in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Let me, if we can during the time that people are registering their votes, introduce a couple of guests of the Legislature. We have under the south balcony a guest of Senator Bromm, Melinda Rasmussen from Mead and also under the south balcony a guest of Senator Janssen we have LuAnn Ruwe and Rachel Ruwe from Uehling, Nebraska. Would you please stand and be recognized. Have you all voted? Senator Vrtiska.

SENATOR VRTISKA: I don't want to, but I guess I'll have to make a call of the house in order to get enough people in here to vote.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Question is, shall the house go under call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record.

ASSISTANT CLERK: 11 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Mr. President.
