SENATOR LINDSAY: Thank you, Madam President, I would just assure Senator Witek as long as the Attorney General's Office and she continue to be reasonable, I can assure that I would continue to work. I would urge the adoption of the amendment.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Lindsay. The question is the adoption of the Lindsay amendment to LB 598. All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. Record, please.

ASSISTANT CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of Senator Lindsay's amendment.

SENATOR CROSBY: The amendment is adopted. Anything further, Mr. Clerk?

ASSISTANT CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill.

SENATOR CROSBY: On the bill, Senator Lindsay? Any further discussion on LB 598? Seeing none, did you want to close? The question is, shall LB 598 be advanced to E & R Initial? All in favor vote aye, opposed no. Record, please.

ASSISTANT CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to advance 598 to E & R Initial.

SENATOR CROSBY: LB 598 advances. LB 739.

ASSISTANT CLERK: LB 739 was introduced by Senators McKenzie and Schimek. (Read title.) The bill was read for the first time on January 19, referred to the Health and Human Services Committee. That committee reports the bill to General File with committee amendments attached.

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Wesely, on the committee amendments.

LB 739 is a bill Senator McKenzie introduced to deal with the Family Policy Act which is a bill we passed back in 1987 to determine the direction of family policy and how we would assist families in this state.
