

specific direction of what to do when you're a chief executive officer or, oh, we call them executive directors in some other commissions and so on.

SENATOR HALL: Well, what if we were to...and I can't speak because this is Senator Lindsay's amendment, but...so I won't. I'll let him run his own amendment, but I'm just...I mean, I'm thinking that there's many of those things that, in Section 11 and in Section 9 that can go away. You could retain the sections, allow for the commission to be established, as it is in Section 9, and give them the duties that are listed in subsection (1) in Section 9 of the proposal, leave Section 10 in place, leave parts of Section 11 in place, 1, 2, 3, possibly some form of Section 12 where you transmit the monthly report and, you know, allow for the ability to remove, appoint or remove employees and delegate their responsibilities to them and have everything that you want without the other boilerplate that shows up in Section 11 and I think you can clean it up so that it is not a problem. Would you be amenable to looking at an amendment to that extent?

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Well, I, yes, I'm always looking and am I willing to do that now, no. One of the things, I suppose you could just say there shall be a commission, they shall promulgate rules to carry out this system and it could be a two-page bill. Now that's what Congress does and, of course, that's where everybody gets angry is that you just let the commission go and you never give them any specific direction.

SENATOR HALL: Sometimes we get angry because they are too specific.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Well, that's exact. right...

SENATOR WESELY: One minute.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: ...and I'm telling you where I'm comfortable at is the way that I...I've gone about 10 miles on this bill already on some of those things and I guess I'm probably getting close to the end of the rope because I tend to think that we've got the essential things left in here, but, you know, I'm not unwilling to sit and listen to what you've got.
