

will do, of course. They are going to have to be accountable and we don't want them to have the ability when we're looking to them for accountability to say, you told the chief counsel to do this, you've got to fund that portion of them and then we need this. And the chief counsel coming in and saying vice versa. We absolutely have to have some accountability. This does not cripple the bill whatsoever. The chief counsel makes it very clear the chief counsel simply reports back to the commission and does what the commission tells the chief counsel to do. With that, I would urge that the amendment be adopted.

SENATOR WESELY: Thank you, Senator Lindsay. That's the closing on the Lindsay amendment to the committee amendments. Those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? We're voting on the Lindsay amendment to the committee amendments. Okay, Senator Lindsay has asked for a record vote. Please record.

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Read record vote. See page 1684 of the Legislative Journal.) The vote is 8 ayes, 13 nays, Mr. President.

SENATOR WESELY: Thank you. Motion fails. Next amendment.

ASSISTANT CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Hall would move to amend. (FA154 appears on page 1685 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR WESELY: Senator Hall.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Mr. President and members. The amendment that I have deals with the page 4 of the bill or the amendment rather, 1587, Senator Kristensen's amendment. And what it does is it deals with the commission's powers, the commission's duties rather, and it basically strikes, if you look at Section 9, it's on page 4 and it falls over onto page 5, it strikes subsections (2), (3), (4), (5), (6), (7) and (8) of Section 9. It leaves Section 1 and Section 9, so 9 would become subsection (1) of Section 9, so the remaining language says this. It says the commission shall adopt and promulgate rules and regulations for its organization and internal management and rules and regulations governing the exercise of its powers and the fulfillment of its purpose, and...and then it goes on to say in subsection (2), provide legal services to indigent persons through the divisions in Section 12 of this act. I take a different approach than Senator Lindsay does...did in his
