SENATOR LINDSAY: Would you have any problem with it explicitly stating that we're not going to have standards and guidelines for all these types of things that are in this report?

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: No, I'm not going to put that in there, no, because I don't think it's necessary.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Well, if it's necessary, what would it hurt?

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Well, why don't we also put in that daylight savings time is going to occur at certain days?

SENATOR LINDSAY: Or why would we put in that the chief counsel is authorized to do all these things that it is already authorized to do? If it's surplusage, why does it...I mean, if it's surplusage, chief counsel's duties, a little more surplus language shouldn't be a problem, should it?

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Senator, I think that the bill it's been pared down and, obviously, what I should do is go back and the things that you didn't like before put back in then. I mean, what I am trying to do is to work with you. I think I've gone ten miles to do so and...
