SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Yes.

SENATOR HALL: ...and the fulfillment of its purpose.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Yes. Does it say that they have the ability and the authority to accept a grant?

SENATOR HALL: If we've allowed them the ability to...

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: The answer is, no.

SENATOR HALL: ...oh, it doesn't say that specifically, but what we have given...

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Right.

SENATOR HALL: ...is very broad powers by your own...

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Exactly.

SENATOR HALL: Okay. By those broad definitions, as you called it when you stood to oppose the amendment,...

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Right.
