SENATOR HALL: ...promulgate rules and regulations for their internal management and the exercise of its powers in the fulfillment of its purpose. If the purpose, as you stated earlier, was to provide indigent defense and all the things that you listed,...

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Uh-huh.

SENATOR HALL: ...doesn't subsection (3) fall within that?

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Well, I don't think that it's necessarily inherent that you're going to plan to improve the system.

SENATOR HALL: So the purpose...

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: I mean, if you don't care about the system being improved, I suppose I'd strike that.

SENATOR HALL: But in...you...in other words, you believe that systems only are improved or if they're spelled out inherently in statute?

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: No, I think that it is wise to give them some direction that we would like them to look at improving the system.

SENATOR HALL: But we do that in this proposal, really, don't we, at the detriment to subsection (9), which is to provide legal services to indigent persons through the divisions in Section 12 of this act.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: No, I don't think so.

SENATOR HALL: Okay, but is there a reason it was listed last?

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: I don't know, I didn't number the draft. I mean, Senator Hall, it's like saying that Withem, because it's at the end of the alphabet, is the least of the senators. Now
