

SPEAKER WITHEM: Do I see four additional hands to Senator Robinson's? I do. Question is, shall debate now cease on the Chambers amendment? All in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Have you all voted. Question is shall the house go under call. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 23 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER WITHEM: The house is under call. Members please return to your seats. Unauthorized parties leave the floor. The house is under call. Absent members please return to the floor. The house is under call. Senator Chambers, could you check in, please. Senator Beutler. Senator Coordsen, Senator Avery, Senator Pirsch, Senator Cudaback, Senator Warner, Senator Schellpeper, Senator Jones, please return to the floor. Senator Robinson, how do you want us to proceed?

SENATOR ROBINSON: Machine vote.

SPEAKER WITHEM: We have taken a machine vote. We either have to take call-in votes or roll call vote.

SENATOR ROBINSON: Take call-in votes.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Call-in votes have been authorized. Question is, shall debate now cease on the Chambers amendment?

CLERK: Senator Warner voting yes. Senator Janssen voting yes. Senator Avery voting yes. Senator Hartnett voting yes. Senator Beutler voting yes.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Record, please.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays to cease debate, Mr. President.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Debate is ceased. Senator Chambers, on your amendment to close. The call is raised.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, my amendment is to strike the emergency clause. Since Senator Wehrbein will not have the opportunity to react to what I'm saying in my close, I will tell you what he indicated during debate for those who may not have been on the floor. If the
