SPEAKER WITHEM: One minute.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Thank you, Senator Chambers. You have heard the closing. The matter before the body at the moment is the adoption of the Chambers amendment. All in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...for a call of the house and a roll call vote.

SPEAKER WITHEM: The question is, shall the house go under call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record.

CLERK: 18 ayes, 1 nay to go under call, Mr. President.
