

SENATOR BOHLKE: Question.

SPEAKER WITHEM: The question has been called. Do I see five hands? I do. The question now is, shall debate now cease on the Dierks amendment? All in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Motion is to cease debate. Have you all voted? Senator Bohlke.

We are voting on calling the question. There has been a roll call vote requested. Senator Lindsay, you're the one who requested a roll call. Senator Bohlke had requested the call of the house. She's authorized us to proceed. Is that okay with you?

SENATOR LINDSAY: That's fine.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Call the roll, please.
