We need him now, we need people like him back there now that are willing to really reform things. And it isn't happening this way. So for that reason I wanted you to know why in this case, with all due respect to all those people that were trying so hard to do something well, that this to me, I don't think, will mean anything, and it certainly won't help the families.
