

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you. We cease all debate and we move to cloture. The first vote before you is the vote on the motion for cloture. All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Please record.

CLERK: (Read record vote as found on pages 1756-57 of the Legislative Journal.) 34 ayes, 5 nays on the motion to invoke cloture, Madam President.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Cloture is invoked. We move immediately to a vote on LB 455. The question before you is the advancement of LB 455. All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. There's been a request for a roll call vote. Mr. Clerk, please proceed.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 1757 of the Legislative Journal.) 27 ayes, 8 nays on the motion to advance the bill.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: LB 455 advances. LB 455A.

CLERK: Madam President, 455A, a bill by Senator Bohlke. (Read title.)

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The Chair recognizes Senator Bohlke to open on 455A.

SENATOR BOHLKE: Madam President, members, I think we've had a full debate. I've lost track now of the hours we've been on the bill and I just ask your support in moving 455A.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Bohlke. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam President, members of the Legislature, I hope that Senator Bohlke and those who support LB 455 realize that 455A is a different bill, and it...we have not had eight hours of debate on it, so they cannot, even under the rules, invoke cloture on this bill. And I am very uncomfortable with LB 455 and I do not support, as my voted indicated, LB 455, so there is no way that I can support LB 455A. But, Senator Bohlke, Senator Bohlke,...

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Bohlke.

SENATOR BOHLKE: Yes.
