

SENATOR PIRSCH: I think we should have a call of the house.

SPEAKER WITHEM: The question before the body is, shall the house go under call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 13 ayes, 5 nays to go under call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER WITHEM: The house is under call. All members return to the Chamber, record their presence. Unauthorized parties leave the floor. Senator Lindsay, Senator Bernard-Stevens, Senator McKenzie, Senator Bromm, and Senator Coordsen. Senator Elmer, and Senator Jensen. Roll call vote has been requested. Mr. Clerk, who is still absent?

CLERK: Senators Bromm and Elmer, Mr. President.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Elmer and Senator Bromm, you are wanted on the floor. The house is under call. Call the roll, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 1785 of the Legislative Journal.) 5 ayes, 22 nays on the amendment.

SPEAKER WITHEM: The amendment is defeated. The call is raised. Next item, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment I have, Senator Pirsch, you have the next amendment but I have a note that you want to withdraw this one, Senator. It's AM...

SENATOR PIRSCH: Which amendment is that?

CLERK: It's the same amendment Senator Pedersen adopted, the emergency clause.

SENATOR PIRSCH: 0972, yeah, withdraw that, please.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Wesely, AM1169, Senator. This was the amendment to Senator Pirsch's that you deferred on.

SENATOR WESELY: Oh, we don't need to do that anymore, so I will withdraw that.
