And these resolutions which contain language like that are an affront to me, not to you all, because America is great to you, it is, and you can love it. My children, when they were in school, did not have to say the salute to the flag, and I made the teachers know it, because I told them and they could see the way they were treated at school. There is not liberty and justice for all, not for all of us. And when we see signs that say, all are invited, we know that word "all" does not include us. And the all in Senator Pirsch's resolution does not include us.

SPEAKER WITHEM: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And we know it. And, Senator Pirsch, this is where that legal term comes in, "Res ipsa loquitur", the thing speaks for itself, the facts speak for themselves. You all will pass these resolutions and won't give it a thought. You'll be upset when somebody says, curse the flag and burn it. Be happy that all they do is burn the flag and don't burn the country. Be happy that there are black people who will send somebody like me to the Legislature and try to reason with you and tell you things, even though you get angry, instead of loading a truck full of dynamite and blowing up this building. When the spies sell your secrets to the Soviets or anybody else, is it somebody of my complexion? Was Aldrich Ames a black man? When you look at those who truly do the things that hurt this country and undermine...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And this will be my last time. I'm not going to offer amendments to prolong it, but I've got to say it. And I would be a sniveling, weak, spineless, worthless coward if I stood in a white assembly such as this which is supposed to represent the whole state and did not say what needs to be said, and what I'm saying needs to be said, not only here but in every
