

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The house is under call. Will senators please return to their seats. Will all unauthorized personnel please leave the floor. The house is under call. We are accepting call-in votes. The question before you is the adoption of the Abboud amendment to LB 887. We are accepting call-in votes. Will Senator Pirsch, Senator Witek, will you please check in. Will senators check in. Senator Zohlke, Senator Matzke, Senator Preister, Senator Robinson, Senator Schellpeper, Senator Schimek, Senator Coordsen, Senator Crosby, Senator Day, Senator Stuhr, Senator Wesely, Senator Hudkins, Senator Withem.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Chair recognizes Senator Abboud.

SENATOR ABOUD: Madam President, colleagues, this is the second and final amendment that will be offered to this bill by myself. This was the one that I just described, Robert Reed from Norfolk, in the amount of \$82,500. It was a workers' compensation claim signed by Judge Novicoff, the order was. This individual was represented without counsel, so there is no attorney involved in this one. And, Senator Maurstad, you'll be happy to know that he actually got more money without an attorney, so I don't know what that means. But anyway, the claim is for 82,500.
