SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Um-huh, um-huh.

SENATOR BEUTLER: And it just doesn't seem we're treating them the same as we do others.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: It probably should have been handled as a deficit, because some of these we do have to handle when you don't know exactly how much. And I can't recall the circumstances right at this point.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: So I would need...I would need to get a little information, and I can give it to you, get it to you.

SENATOR BEUTLER: I would appreciate that, thank you. Thank you, Senator Abboud.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Beutler. Is there any further discussion on the advancement of LB 887? Seeing none, the question before you is the advancement of LB 887. All those in favor say aye. All those opposed nay. LB 887 advances. LB 337.

CLERK: Madam President, 337 was discussed on April 21. E & R amendments were adopted at that time. An amendment by Senator Wickersham to the bill was adopted. The Legislature left the bill with an amendment by Senator Schimek and Senator Bromm pending. Senator, this is the handwritten amendment that you had turned in on Friday. I think you may want to withdraw this one.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: It's withdrawn.

CLERK: The next amendment I have, Madam President, is by Senator Witek. Senator, AM1740. (Amendment can be found on page 1788 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The Chair recognizes Senator Witek to open on her amendment.

SENATOR WITEK: Madam Chairman, members of the body, this amendment has to do with a provision of 337 that talks about the length of time that an individual has to be registered to vote in the State of Nebraska before they can circulate a petition.
