

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Bromm. Senator Schimek.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: No, I just urge support of the Bromm amendment. Thank you.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Schimek. The question before you is the adoption of the Bromm amendment to LB 337. All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. Please record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on adoption of Senator Bromm and Schimek's amendment to the bill.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The Bromm amendment is adopted.

CLERK: Senator Chambers would move to amend the bill. (Chambers amendment, FA163, may be found on page 1796 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The Chair recognizes Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam President, members of the Legislature, Mr. Clerk, is this the one I just put up there with the word "only"?

CLERK: Yes, sir.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. The reason I didn't circulate this amendment I can save a little paper and I can tell you very quickly what it does. On page 7 of the Enrollment and Review amendments, in the area that we're dealing with, if you look in line 10, I mean 11, after the stricken language I would insert the word "only". This is the way it would then read, "the signature and address shall be presumed to be valid only if the election commissioner" and so forth. It doesn't change any of the language of the presumption. It doesn't change or modify in any way that word "match". What the purpose of it is, is to state this presumption the same way it would be found stated in other laws. It will arise only if the specific items listed below are found. The reason I won't go into detail about those items is because there may be some discussion about what the word "match" would mean. In talking to Senator Bromm, I was trying to come up with a way to explain this that I'm doing because it is so simple, the more you try to explain it, the
