

Crosby, no, this bill does a lot of good things and I think it does what you want it to do but I would just suggest to you that some of these things are going to have to be...they're going to have to be issued by rules and regulations for these county clerks and election commissioners. We can't do it all here on the floor today and shouldn't do it all here on the floor today because there will be many things that we don't...that we don't take into account. There are many court decisions that we're not familiar with and that's what the Secretary of State's office is for. Thank you.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Schimek. Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Madam President and members of the Legislature, I, too, would rise to oppose the proposal. I guess, I think, what people are trying to get to perhaps instead of putting in substantially or match, I don't have any problem with the word "match" as far as that goes, but it's to make it possible to identify the person and their place of residence. But, Senator Bromm, you might tell me if I give you four address...four addresses if you would say any of those would be substantial for a match. If I was to tell you I lived at 6405 North 134th Street or if I was to tell you I live in the southeast one-quarter of 32-118, or if I was to tell you that I'm Rural Route 01, Box 100A, or Waverly Precinct #1, is any of those substantially the same? I would suggest that somebody checking would have to say, well, no, the Waverly Precinct #1 would cover them all. But I share Senator Crosby's concern. I mentioned to somebody when I go down to vote and everybody on the elec...it used to be that everybody on the election board knew me as long as I was alive and I was getting to the point where I've known them as long they were alive, which is a little different. But nevertheless I am required to sign exactly as I registered when I was 21, which I use nowhere else. They all know me but I'm signed exact and I'm also periodically requested to identify where I live, as a matter of...and they all know where I live. But that's proper for them to do as well and I know legally I'm southeast one-quarter 32-118. That's my legal residence. I think it's important for...and the only state interest is the compelling state interest for prevention of fraud. That's...you know, we talk a lot about the different things but the compelling state interest is prevention of fraud. If the courts have ruled that registration is constitutional because it prevents fraud, obviously, it seems to me it's necessary and desirable then that names and signatures, rather, and addresses
