They'll jerk you out of that water and they'll be laughing at you while they drink and do whatever lobbyists do when they leave the sucker bin which is what the Legislature is. This motion, Senator Hall, probably will fail. They probably will not vote to kill this bill. Too much power out in the lobby and those gambling lobbyists deal with other bills too. They lobby for other bills and other issues and they will prevail today. PRESIDENT ROBAK: Time. Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Hall, followed by Senators Lynch, Abboud, Jensen and Dierks.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Madam President, members. Again I rise in opposition to the motion to indefinitely postpone and I wanted to clear something up. If I stated in my opening somehow that I thought that this was not a moral issue, I only meant that in respect to myself because I truly understand that there are people who believe that this is morally wrong, so those who speak to that issue, Senator Janssen, Senator Wesely spoke of the folks in his district, I completely understand and recognize that and I did not want to leave the impression that somehow I felt that there were those who would be wrong if they felt it was a moral issue and to that end I want to correct the record
