PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Wesely, your light is next. This is the motion to bracket until May 2nd.

SENATOR WESELY: I oppose the motion to bracket. We've spent a number of days and hours on this, we've defeated a number of amendments. I don't know that there's any purpose to be gained by delaying the issue any longer. I believe we ought to move forward on the legislation and not take any more floor time on it. So I oppose the motion to bracket and I believe we should go forward and advance the bill.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Wesely. Senator Chambers, to speak on the bracket motion. Senator Pirsch, to speak to the bracket motion.

SENATOR PIRSCH: Thank you, Madam President, members of the body. I do have several amendments which will take quite a bit of time, and in the interest of cooperation I will go along and support this bracket motion, hoping that we can perhaps find, on those numerous amendments, some common ground. And so I urge you to support until May 2nd. Thank you.
