

know which region they went to. In this case are all of the six regions and the private operators eligible for these funds? And will the...is there an enabling, is there some kind of language in there that indicates that they can all participate with some, I'm sure some qualifications?

SENATOR WESELY: It isn't specific as to how this will be utilized or how distributed, so I can't tell you that that's absolutely clear in the language. But I can tell you I know Senator Robak is intent, and I'm sure mine as well, we want this distributed across the state to fill needs. And so if you want some intent language right now...

SENATOR LYNCH: No.

SENATOR WESELY: ...it would be that every region should be able to participate and get some of this additional funding, it should be disbursed statewide, not in any one region or leave any region out, they all should have a chance at the money.

SENATOR LYNCH: Is the program that was accessed with that 400 and some thousand last time, went to Region V or to Lancaster County, actually, not to the region. Is that still in effect? Are we still providing \$400,000 worth of General Fund revenues for that program or...

SENATOR WESELY: I don't know the answer to that.

SENATOR LYNCH: ...you don't know?

SENATOR WESELY: I could find out.

SENATOR LYNCH: Okay. That's usually through DPI, but if you could I'd really...I'd really be curious to know that.

SENATOR WESELY: All right.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator. Senator Bernard-Stevens.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Thank you, Madam Chair, Madam President. Senator Wesely, again to continue a couple of comments. And, Senator Robak, I hope you're not upset that I'm asking Don, but being the Chair of the committee I thought maybe he would do that, if you don't mind. Don, I'm asking now a more specific question on Region II. And I believe, and I could be
