

three dollars provided from the General Fund. Of the amount provided by each regional governing board, not less than 40 percent shall be provided by local and county taxes, and the remainder shall come from nonfederal sources. Funds provided by the regional governing board for mental health and alcohol and drug abuse services shall be continued...provide an amount which is not less than the total amount contributed as certified matching funds. I don't know if that answers your question or not, but we do have a new board that the makeup of the board is not less than 14 consumers and family members, with no more than 4 from one region, 1 regional program administrator, 6 service providers, 1 representative from the Division of Vocational Rehabilitation of the State Department of Education, 1 representative from the Department of Social Services, 1 representative from the Department of Public Institutions, 1 representative from the Nebraska Commission on Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice, 1 representative from the Housing Office of the Community and Rural Development Division of the Department of Economic Development, 1 representative from the State Department of Education other than the member appointed under subdivision E of this subsection, and other members as appointed by the Governor. So with that type of makeup I think you can rest assured that the six arms of the mental health regions will have equal access to these funds. I just urge the adoption of amendment 1388. Thank you.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Robak. Question before you is the adoption of the Robak amendment to LB 752. All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Please record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the adoption of Senator Robak's amendment.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The Robak amendment is adopted.

CLERK: Senator Robak, I now have AM1443, Senator.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Chair recognizes Senator Robak.

SENATOR ROBAK: Thank you, Madam President and members of the body. This amendment is found on page 1485 of the Journal. It's offered only to harmonize language by substituting "severe, persistent and disabling psychiatric disorders for mental illness" in several lines of AM1388 which now becomes the bill.
