

It also adds a definition of severe, persistent and disabling psychotic disorders in the definition section. I ask that you adopt this amendment.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Robak. Is there any discussion of the Robak amendment? Senator Bernard-Stevens.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Thank you, Madam President. Senator Robak, I guess I'm doing more of this for the record because after a surprise vote that we had on the gambling issue, no one's mind is where it needs to be right now. And I know you've worked real hard on this. It's kind of a substantive amendment that we have. Could you just take another minute or so of my time at least to explain again what changes this would make in the bill that we have.

SENATOR ROBAK: The amendment, 1388, is that what you're asking for?

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Yes, the one on page 1485.

SENATOR ROBAK: All right, I will try to do that.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: It will be amendment 1443.

SENATOR ROBAK: Okay. Oh, well give me a minute to find some papers here.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Yeah, and the reason I'm having difficulty is that when I just look at the amendment, and again all of this came up quickly so all of us are a little bit...not as prepared as we need to be. But when we go to...

SENATOR ROBAK: Okay.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: ...where it says on page 2, line 24, strike "and", and before "case", it's kind of hard to get a picture...

SENATOR ROBAK: Well, the first...
