SENATOR DIERKS: Thank you, Madam President and members of the body. I'd like to ask Senator Day a question or two, if I may.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Day.

SENATOR DIERKS: I...when reading some of the amendments it sounded like when you're talking about license revocation you're talking about professional licenses. Is that wrong, or is that right?

SENATOR DAY: That's correct. In the child support area for right away, we're talking about driver's license, professional and occupational license. Under visitation interference right away the judges will be able to pull the driver's license. In January of '97, we will include professional and occupational license. The reason we did that was the courts were not sure how they have the right to pull those licenses, and that's why we're giving time to work that out. But for child support, nonpayment of child support it's driver's license, professional and occupational licenses.

SENATOR DIERKS: Well, just stay right there, we're not done yet.
