SENATOR DAY: I would hope, Senator Chambers, that we have enough checks and balances in there and enough processes for them to go through before that license is revoked that that would not happen.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: If that happens...well, wait a minute, your belief is that the system is so fail-safe and foolproof that that won't happen. You don't believe anybody's drivers license will be inappropriately revoked, in other words? Is that your belief?

SENATOR DAY: Yes, that's my belief.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Day, do you believe rabbits lay Easter eggs?

SENATOR DAY: (Laughter.) No.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Now, in order to get this bill out of committee...or I'll go ahead and ask you the other question. If the referee fails to resolve whatever the referee is refereeing, there is the right for the person to then go into District Court?

SENATOR DAY: Yes, if either parties don't agree, they can take it on into District Court.
