

CLERK: 20 ayes, 0 nays to go under call.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The house is under call. Will all senators please return to their seats and please check in. Will all unauthorized personnel please the floor, the house is under call. Senator Fisher, Senator Schellpeper, Senator Jones, Senator Jensen, Senator Witek, Senator Pedersen, Senator Landis, Senator Cudaback, Senator Pirsch, Senator Maurstad, Senator Matzke, Senator Schrock, Senator Brown, Senator Elmer, Senator Lynch and Senator Wesely. We're waiting on Senator Fisher, Senator Witek, Senator Jensen, Senator Pirsch and Senator Wesely. We're waiting on Senator Witek and Senator Pirsch. Go ahead? The question before the body is the adoption of the Day amendment to the committee amendments to LB 592. All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote nay. Senator Day.

SENATOR DAY: Can we have a roll call vote, please.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: There's been a request for a roll call vote. Mr. Clerk, please proceed.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The Day amendment is adopted. We return now to the committee amendments. Mr. Clerk, other amendments.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: I raise the call. Senator Day, to open on her amendment.

SENATOR DAY: Thank you, Madam President, and colleagues, we have...we're passing out some information on this amendment. It's fairly easy to understand and it's one that certainly raised my comfort zone with this entire legislation. The first thing it does is require that the Director of Social Services will report back to the Legislature on how many licenses are revoked every year. We talked about this earlier. I think this is important for us to know. If there are a large number of licenses being revoked, this legislation is not working and we will immediately need to change it. So I think that's important that we keep informed. The second part of the amendment is to set up within the court system, again going back to the child
